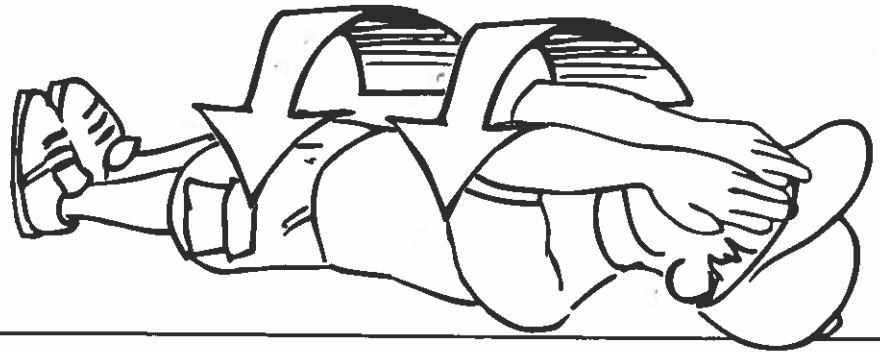
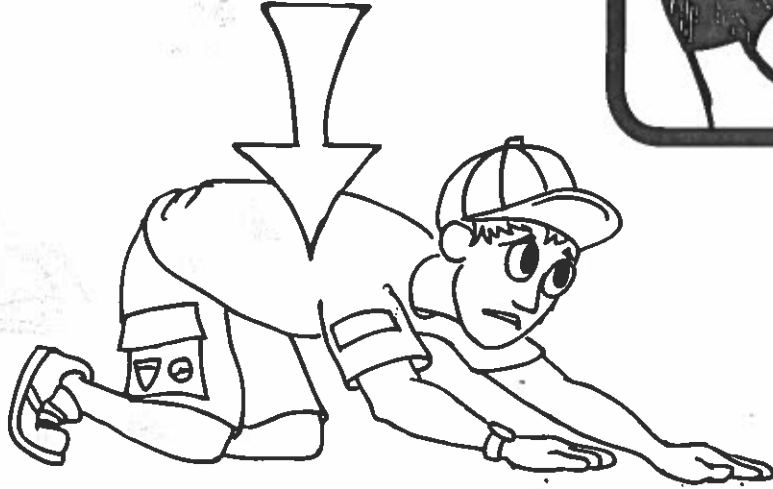


STOP, DROP AND ROLL.

THE FIRE TRIANGLE

Skills: Matching/Coloring

A fire needs **AIR**, **HEAT** and **FUEL** or it goes out. **AIR**, **HEAT** and **FUEL** are the fire triangle. Take away one side of the fire triangle and the fire goes out.

- This is a range fire. Above it are three ways to put it out. Match each item to the side of the triangle it takes away.



Take away one and the fire goes out!

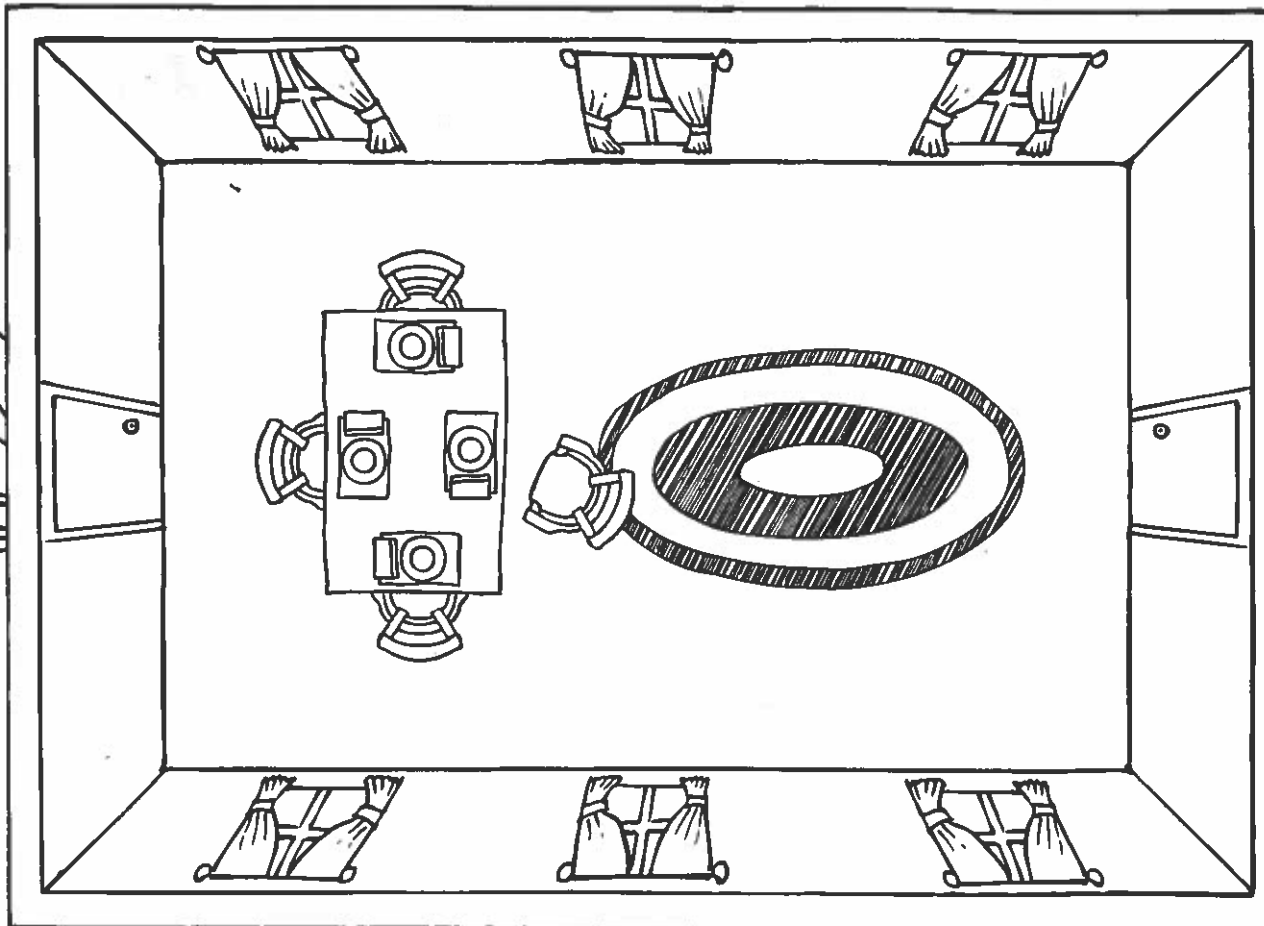


GET OUT FAST

If you are in a burning building, feel the doors.

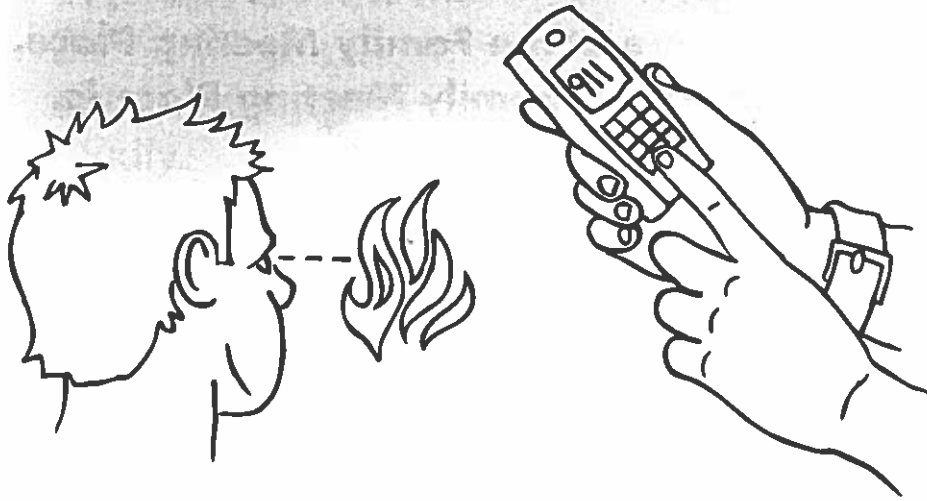

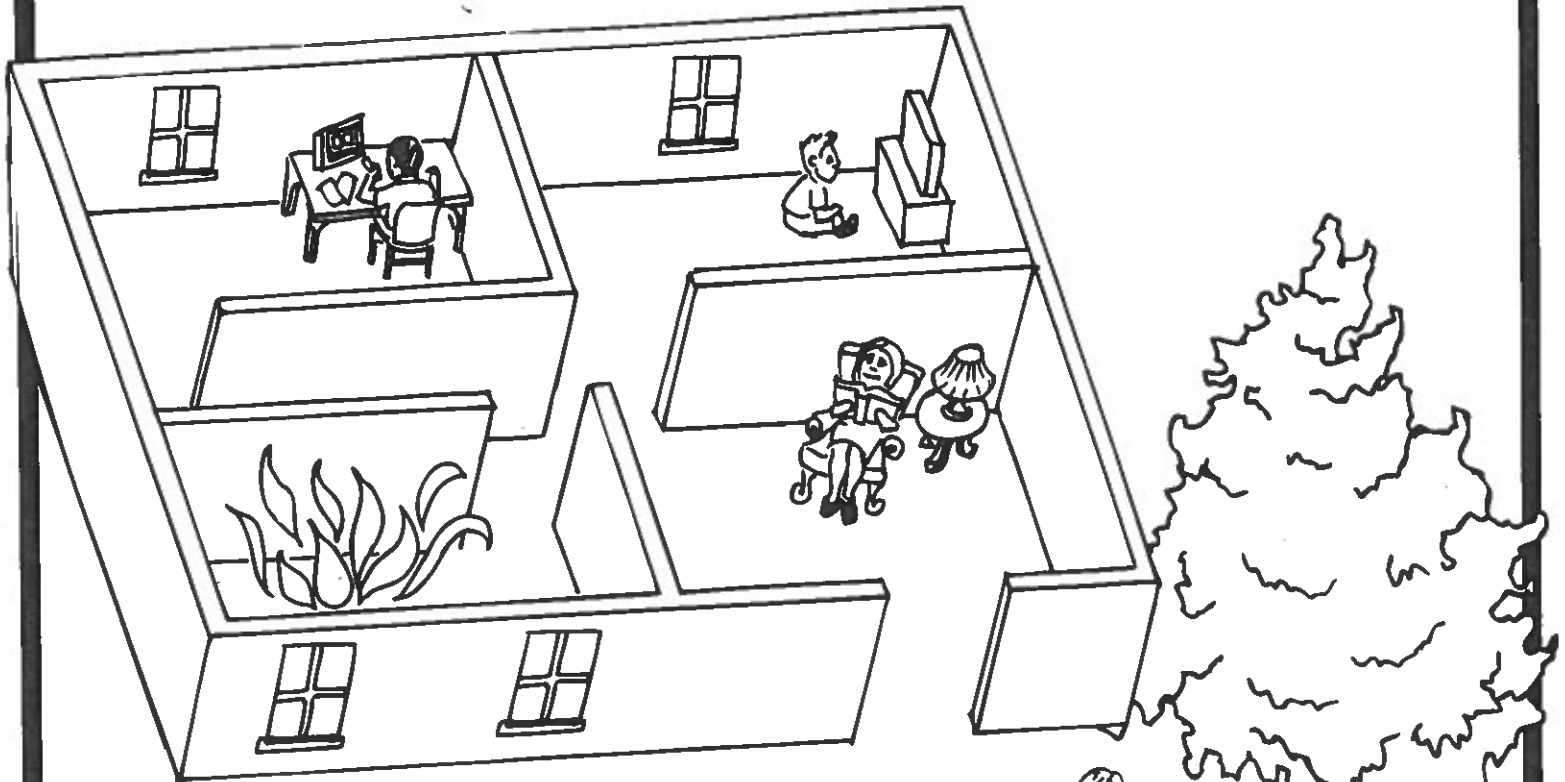
ESCAPE TO YOUR MEETING PLACE

Skills: Reasoning/Concept Comprehension/Coloring

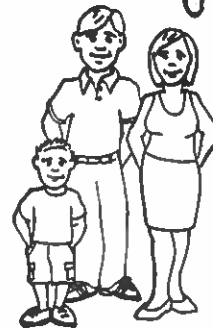
If your house catches on fire, you don't want to run though it looking for everyone. That is why you need a Family Meeting Place.

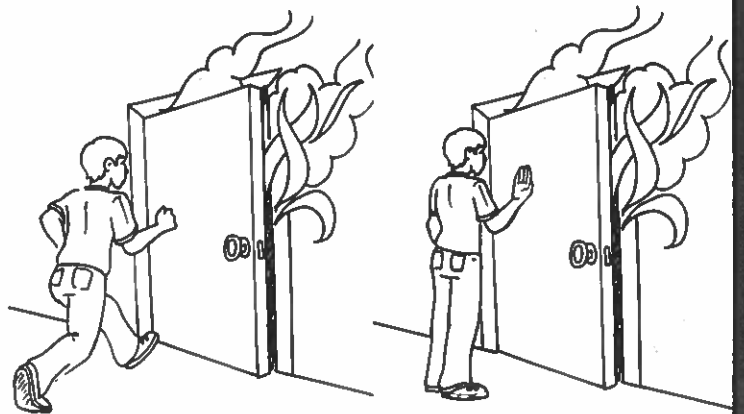
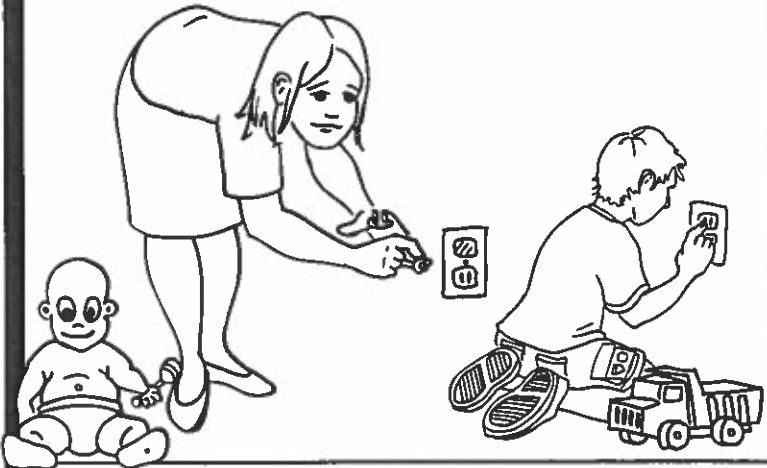
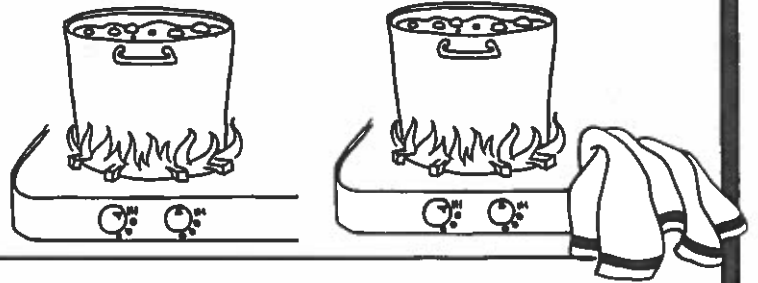


SAFE OR UNSAFE DO YOU KNOW?

- Draw your own safe and unsafe picture.

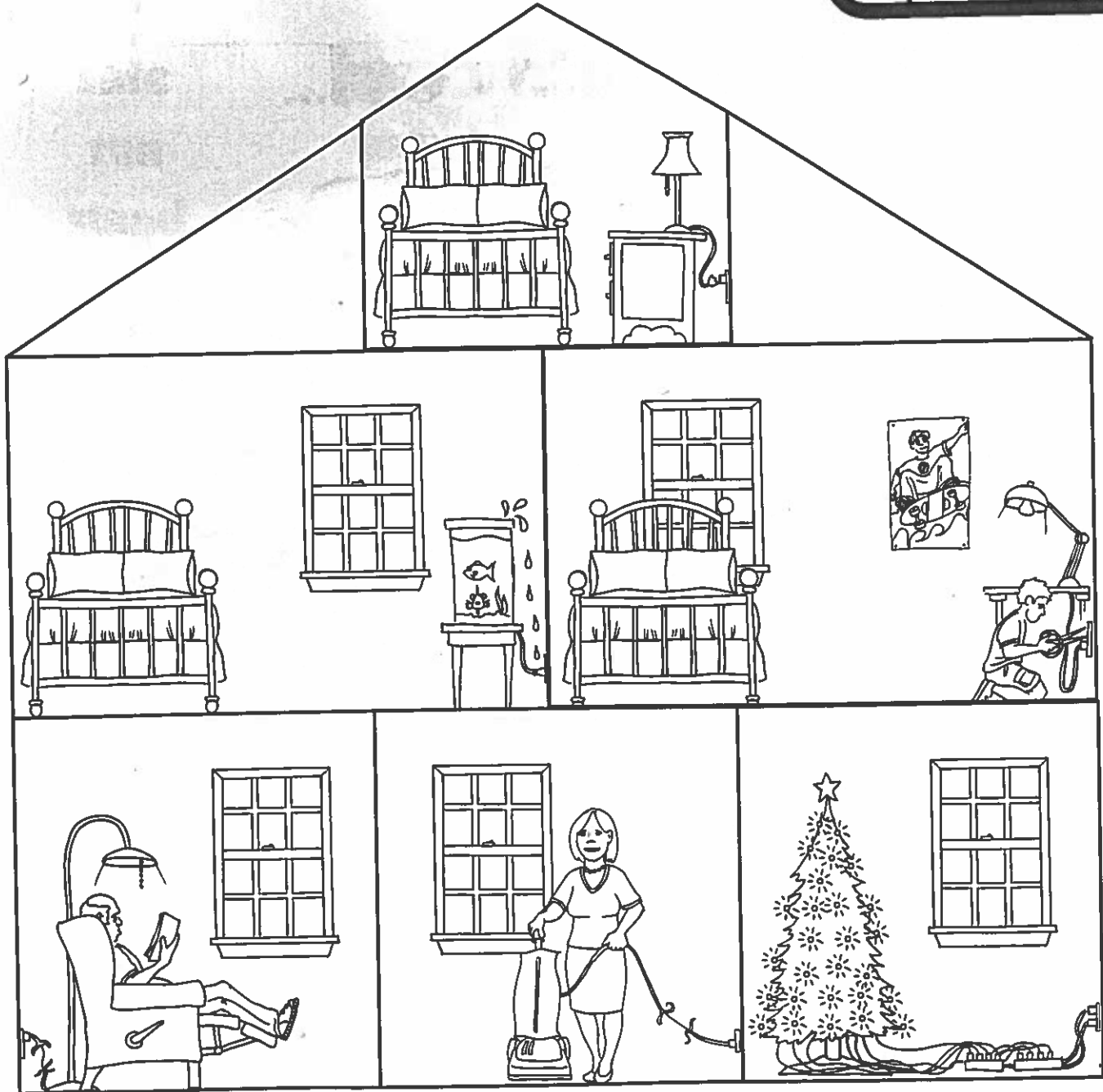


A SHOCKING FACT! ELECTRICITY CAN CAUSE A FIRE.

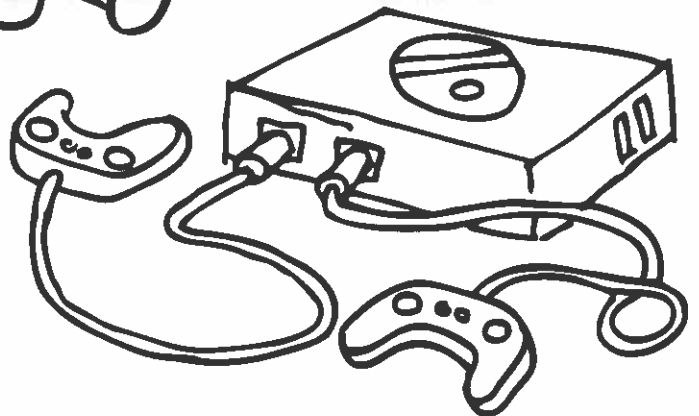
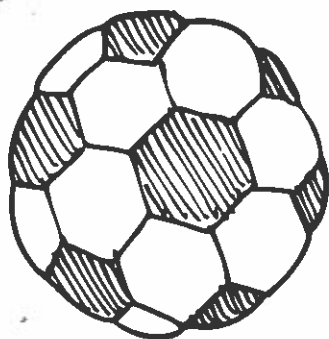
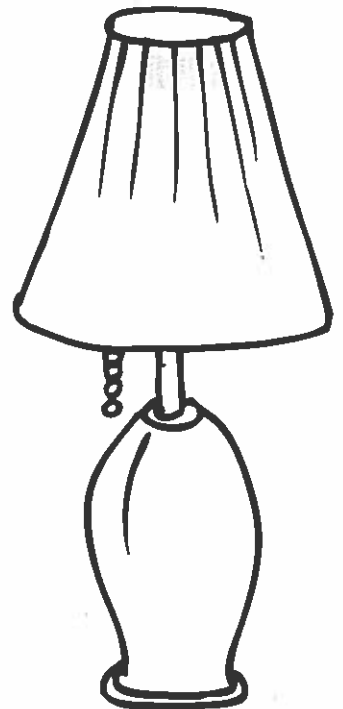
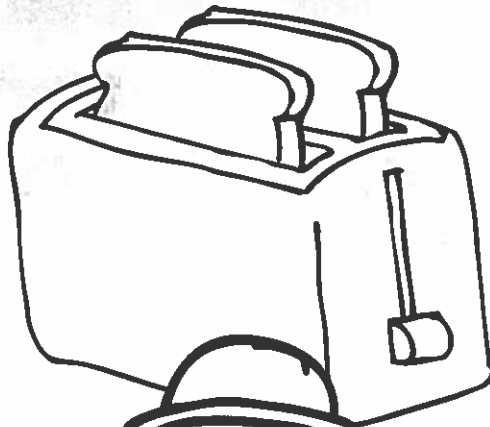
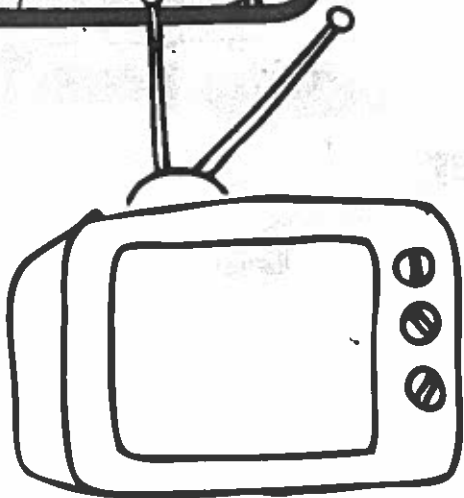


ELECTRIFYING FACTS!

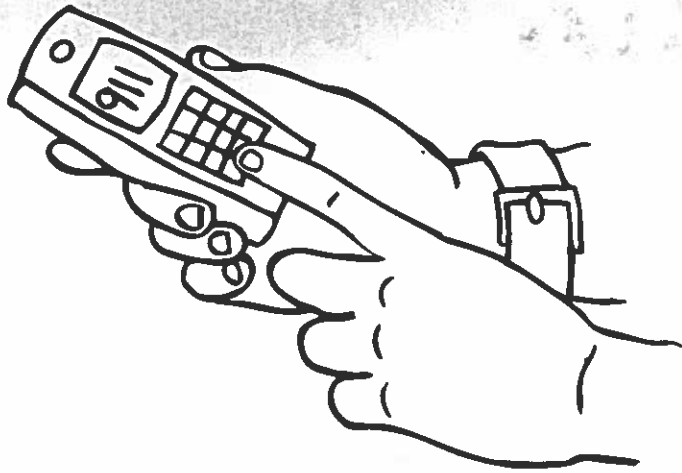

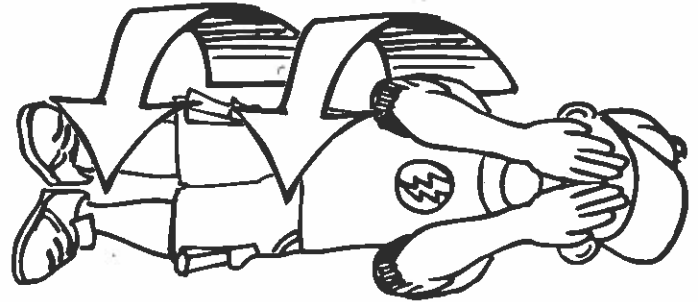

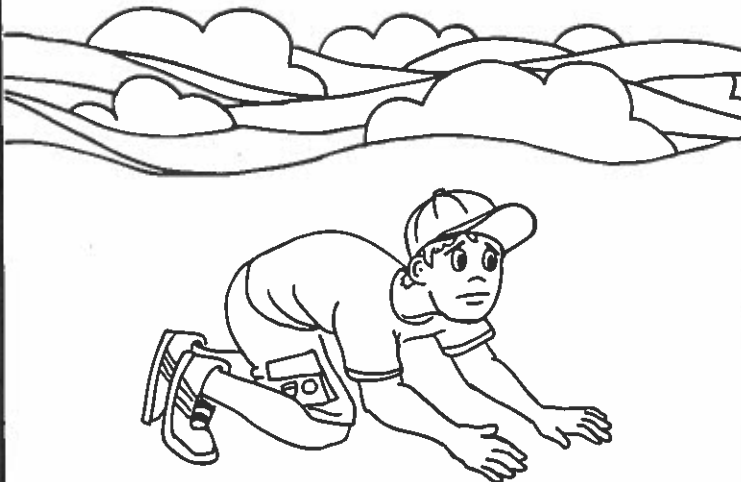
